## **Asking For and Giving Direction**

### **Objective :**

### **Arriving**

Mr. Urvandez : I'm phoning about the factory visit next Friday. What should I do when arrive?

Mr. Cook : Park in the visitors' car park in front of the factory and then go to the gatehouse. It's directly opposite the entrance to the car park. The security people will sign you in and give you a visitor's badge. My assistant will come down to meet you.

Mr. Urvandez : OK, thanks. Look forward to seeing you on Friday, then.

**After arriving the site, the Production Manager welcomes you and he'd like to show the layout of the factory. Here is an example to describe the layout.**

### **Describing the layout**

Good morning, everybody. Welcome to Chemiost factory. I'm very pleased so many of you could make it here today. my name's Sam Weiss. I'm the Production Manager. I'd like to show you the layout of the factory before we go and visit it. As you can see from this diagram, everything is under one roof. We've designed it this way to help the flow of materials and to avoid bottlenecks.

This area here is where we keep our raw materials. The main production area – our machine hall – is situated next to it. Maintenance is situated between the stores and the production area. Just to the right of Maintenance, there are steps up to the Lab and the Admin Section. Process control is also on the upper level. It's located above the factory floor so that the operators can monitor everything that is going on below.

## **Giving directions**

it's this way

continue straight ahead for about a mile (*one mile is approximately 1.6 kilometres*)

continue past the fire station

you'll pass a supermarket on your left

keep going for another ...  
hundred yards (*about 91 metres*)  
two hundred metres  
half mile (*about 800 metres*)  
kilometre

it'll be ...  
on your left  
on your right  
straight ahead of you  
Go straight on (until you come to ...).  
Turn back./Go back.  
Turn left/right (into ...-street).  
Go along ...  
Cross ...  
Take the first/second road on the left/right
